

Substance Abuse Treatment in Lancaster County Frequently Asked Questions

Where do I go to get help?

Getting an assessment is the first place to start. Any outpatient treatment provider can assist you in getting an assessment (go to <u>www.compassmark.org/outpatient_help.html</u> to view the outpatient substance abuse treatment providers in Lancaster County). OUTPATIENT AND INTENSIVE OUTPATIENT Stay in treatment with your therapist and pay only the amount of your financial liability each month.	HMO Many Health Maintenance Organizations (HMO's) provide D&A coverage. It is important that you follow the correct procedures or the D&A treatment will not be covered. In most cases, pre-authorization from the HMO is required.
OR RESIDENTIAL TREATMENT Your therapist will call the case management unit of the Lancaster County D&A Commission to review your case and discuss approval for the payment of these services.	VETERAN'S BENEFITS Most military veterans are eligible for D&A treatment services. Both the Lebanon and Coatesville VA Hospitals provide D&A treatment services. There are also outreach and outpatient programs for veterans.
If approved, you may go to one of several County contracted rehabilitation centers, halfway houses, or a partial program.	PRIVATE PAY If you have the ability to pay for your D&A treatment, you are able to choose any facility you can afford.

How do I know what level of care or help I need?

You can be assessed directly at any outpatient treatment provider that has a contract with Lancaster County (go to <u>www.compassmark.org/outpatient help.html</u> to view the outpatient substance abuse treatment providers in Lancaster County).

What are the different types of services available in Lancaster County for substance abuse treatment?

When it comes to problems with alcohol and other drugs, help comes in many forms:

- <u>Inpatient Treatment</u>: Inpatient treatment is a residential approach to treatment where the client resides in a treatment facility during the course of treatment. Inpatient treatment can be short, medium, or long-term and usually involves intensive counseling as well as other services that support recovery (go to <u>http://www.compassmark.org/inpatient_help.html</u> to view inpatient treatment options in Lancaster County).
- <u>Outpatient Treatment</u>: Outpatient treatment is non-residential, although partial residential programs are also included in this category (go to <u>http://www.compassmark.org/outpatient_help.html</u> to view outpatient treatment options in Lancaster County).
- <u>Other Treatment and Services</u>: This category includes emergency services, helplines, and support groups (go to <u>http://www.compassmark.org/treatment_options.html</u> to view other treatment options and services).
