The World Helpers assembled 40 care packages each containing: a pair of winter socks and gloves, a beanie, a fleece blanket, a toothbrush, a tube of toothpaste, a stick of deodorant, a first aid kit, a reusable water bottle, and a letter of encouragement. A video was also shared on the school’s announcements. It highlighted the group’s time together, defined homelessness, and provided suggestions on how others can help those experiencing homelessness. 
