Landis Run Intermediate School

After facilitating a stretching yet rewarding virtual format of the program, Compass Mark was eager to host another in-person LFG cohort at our long-time partnering school, Landis Run Intermediate School (LRIS). Our current LFG cohort consists of 23 students – several of whom are returning students from last year's virtual cohort for a packed and energetic 12 weeks of program. This is also an exciting time of growth, as facilitators welcome six student mentors to help run the program. Our mentors are middle & high school students who had completed the program from previous years and have now returned to take on new leadership responsibilities within LFG.

Similar to our LFG students in Columbia, our LRIS students quickly expressed their passion for taking care of their school property through environmental awareness and efforts. Calling themselves the "Trash Troopers", our LRIS students will use this passion to drive their environmental service project. They plan to spend time during LFG's afterschool hours to clean up littered trash around the school property. Over several weeks, students will measure how much trash they have collected, and use that visual to share with their school how every individual's choice makes an impact. Through this, the Trash Troopers plan to save the environment one piece at a time. Simultaneously, the team has been learning and practicing several leadership qualities. Thus far, these have included positive communication skills, listening, emotions, stress management, and decision making.
