# A Little Bit About Our Presenters

## Keynote Speaker: Chris Glover

### **Project Coordinator of Joining Forces for Children @ Penn Medicine Lancaster General**

In this role, she coordinates a collaborative effort among youth- and family-serving agencies to identify and support children impacted by substance use. Chris relies on her background as a special education teacher, a non-profit administrator, and a public health professional while incorporating her family's experience with addiction and recovery. As a natural advocate, she applies the science of hope to support others in their own recovery process.

## Leo Hegarty

### **Regional DUI Program Administrator, PA DUI Association**

Leo Hegarty is currently a Regional DUI Program Administrator for the Pennsylvania DUI Association where he provides law enforcement agencies with assistance in impaired driving investigations in the form of administrative and technical expertise; training; on-site monitoring of PennDOT grant funded enforcement initiatives; as well as review of enforcement plans and subsequent reports. Prior to his current role, Leo served with the Pennsylvania State Police for 25 years, retiring September of 2019 at the rank of Lieutenant. As a Patrol Trooper he was often recognized by his Troop's Command Staff as one of the Troop leaders in impaired driving enforcement. He made impaired driving enforcement a focus of his state police career where he became a SFST Instructor, an Alcohol Breath Test Instructor, as well as one of Pennsylvania's first Drug Recognition Experts (DRE) and DRE Instructor. He has testified extensively in court regarding impaired driving investigations and has been recognized as an expert in evidential breath testing as well as the Drug Evaluation and Classification Program relating to the signs and symptoms of drug use, their effects on the human body, and how they affect person's ability to safely operate a vehicle. Leo has been instructing impaired driving enforcement related classes for over 20 years and stays abreast of current trends in his current role as well as maintaining his DRE certification.

## Kyle Linardo

### **Assistant District Attorney, Lancaster County Office of the District Attorney**

Assistant District Attorney Kyle Edward Linardo was born and raised in Southern NJ and comes from a multi-generation line of law enforcement officers on both sides of his family. ADA Linardo attended college and law school at the University of Richmond in Virginia with the goal of becoming a prosecutor. ADA Linardo graduated from law school and started as an Assistant District Attorney in Philadelphia in 2018 and moved to the Lancaster County District Attorney's Office in March 2020 where he is currently employed. ADA Linardo has litigated numerous DUIs in Philadelphia Municipal Court, Lancaster County Magisterial District Courts, and the Lancaster County Court of Common Pleas. ADA Linardo also currently serves as a co-administrator of Lancaster County's DUI Central Court.

## Ken Montrose

### **Director of Training and Publications, Greenbriar Treatment Center**

Ken Montrose is the Director of Training and Publications for Greenbriar Treatment Center. He has worked for Greenbriar since 1999. Prior to establishing Greenbriar's training and publication division, he was the Director of Clinical Services for two years. For eight years he worked as an addiction specialist at Western Psychiatric Institute and Clinic, establishing recovery programs for patients suffering from severe mental illnesses. A Certified Alcohol and Drug Counselor, he also holds a master's degree in Developmental Psychology. He has been in recovery from his own addiction since October 2, 1988.

Throughout his career he has had three main focuses:

- To integrate mental health and substance abuse services.
- To make training, treatment, and reading materials as down-to-earth and accessible as possible.
- To help professionals adapt to and deal with the ongoing changes and inherent stress of dual diagnosis treatment.

## **Dan Panusky:**

### **Intelligence Supervisor, Drug Enforcement Administration, Philadelphia Division**

Intelligence Supervisor Daniel Panusky entered on duty with the Drug Enforcement Administration in October 1998 as an intelligence research specialist assigned to the Philadelphia Division Office intelligence group, for which he was promoted to supervise in December 2008. In October 2010, Mr. Panusky was assigned to the Liberty Mid-Atlantic High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area program office in Philadelphia, where he managed its Investigative Support Center. In October 2018, Mr. Panusky served as DEA Philadelphia's intelligence collection manager, in which he was responsible for monitoring efforts to fulfill local and national intelligence requirements and identify gaps in intelligence collection. Mr. Panusky was named as the supervisor of the Philadelphia Division's new strategic intelligence group in February 2021. In this role, Mr. Panusky manages a group of intelligence analysts who maintain situational awareness of drug threats, identify emerging drug and related crime trends, facilitate intelligence collection, and disseminate pertinent intelligence products that educate and inform strategic decisions needed to address the most significant drug threats in Pennsylvania and Delaware.

A native of Scranton, Pennsylvania, Mr. Panusky served in the United States Navy from 1993-1995, and earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in Political Science from Millersville University of Pennsylvania in December 1997.

## **Marilyn Stein MEd, CAAP:CJ**

### **Principle, MGS Consulting**

Marilyn graduated from Millersville University with a BA in Social Work. She worked as a Parole Officer in Lancaster County for 23 years. During that tenure she earned a MEd from Penn State University in Training and Development. She serves as Vice-President of the Pennsylvania Certification Board of Directors, she holds a Certified Allied Addiction Certification with a Criminal Justice Specialty, and she is Certified TREM Trainer (Trauma, Recovery and Empowerment Model). She facilitates a Domestic Violence Batterers Intervention Group for the Lancaster County Courts and teaches an Addiction Course for the Millersville University School of Social Work. Marilyn began MGS Consulting, LLC, a training, and consulting business in 2002. Her goal has been to strengthen the relationship between the criminal justice system and recovery. In that role she trains extensively in PA and nationally on topics that include Addiction, Trauma, Ethics and Motivational Interviewing. Marilyn lives in Lancaster PA

## **Corporal John Witkowski**
